**1. Pick the word that is closest in meaning to 'Reveal'**

- (1) Conceal
- (2) Disclose
- (3) Hide
- (4) Ignore

**Correct Answer:** (2) Disclose

**Solution:** '**Reveal**' means to make something known or visible. - Disclose means to make something known or to reveal. - Conceal means to hide or keep something secret, the opposite of reveal. - Hide also means to keep something out of sight, which is not similar to reveal. - Ignore means to pay no attention, which is unrelated to revealing something.

**Correct Answer:** (2) Disclose

**Quick Tip**

Look for synonyms that suggest making something visible or known when you see the word "reveal".

**2. Choose the synonym for 'Practical'.**

- (1) Theoretical
- (2) Impractical
- (3) Useful
- (4) Unrealistic

**Correct Answer:** (3) Useful

**Solution:** '**Practical**' refers to something that is useful or efficient in real situations.

- **Useful** is the correct synonym for practical as it describes something that serves a practical purpose.

- **Theoretical** is the opposite of practical as it deals with abstract ideas rather than real-world applications.

- **Impractical** is the opposite of practical, meaning something not suitable for real-life situations.

- **Unrealistic** suggests something that is not feasible or practical.

**Correct Answer:** (3) Useful

When looking for synonyms of "practical", think about words that suggest usefulness or efficiency.

### 3. Select the word opposite in meaning to 'Transparent'.

- (1) Clear
- (2) Invisible

**Correct Answer:** (3) Opaque

**Solution:** 'Transparent' refers to something that allows light to pass through, such as clear glass.

- **Opaque** is the opposite of transparent as it means something that does not allow light to pass through.

- **Clear** is a synonym of transparent, meaning easily seen through.

- **Invisible** refers to something that cannot be seen at all, which is not exactly opposite to transparent.

- **Shiny** refers to something reflecting light, but it doesn't contradict transparency.

**Correct Answer:** (3) Opaque

#### Quick Tip

In questions about opposites, focus on the key property of the word (e.g., transparency or opacity) to identify the right contrast.

### 4. Choose the antonym for 'Expand'.

**Correct Answer:** (3) Contract

**Solution:** '**Expand**' means to increase in size or scope. - **Contract** is the opposite of expand, meaning to become smaller or narrower. - **Grow** and **Increase** are both synonyms of expand, referring to making something larger. - **Enlarge** also means to make something bigger, which is synonymous with expand.

**Correct Answer:** (3) Contract

#### Quick Tip

When finding antonyms, think about words that indicate a reduction in size or scope when compared to the original term.

### 5. What does the idiom 'At the drop of a hat' mean?

**Solution:** '**At the drop of a hat**' is an idiom that means something happening immediately or without delay.

- **With great difficulty** is the opposite of the ease implied by the phrase.
- **Without thinking** refers to spontaneous action, but the idiom emphasizes immediacy.
