# Recognition

- 1. Sreenarayanaguru Open University was established as a State University vide Ordinance No.45 of 2020 and subsequently Sreenarayanaguru Open University Act 1 of 2021 of the Kerala State Legislative Assembly has legitimized its identity.
- 2. The University Grants Commission (UGC), Vide letter No.F.No.9-17/2020 (CPP-I/PU) dt.29/01/2021 informed that Sreenarayanaguru Open University, Kollam, Kerala has been included in the list of Universities established as per 2(f) of UGC Act 1956.
- 3. The University Grants Commission (UGC) Vide letter F.No.3-5/2022(DEBI14) dt.02/09/2022 informed that as per the Regulation 22 of University Grants Commission (Open and Distance Learning Programmes and Online Programmes) regulations, 2020 stipulates that "Degrees at undergraduate and postgraduate level in conformity with UGC notification on Specification of Degrees, 2014 and, Post Graduate Diplomas awarded through Open and Distance Learning mode and/or Online mode by Higher Educational Institutions, recognized by the Commission under these regulations, shall be treated as equivalent to the corresponding awards of the Degrees at undergraduate and postgraduate level and post graduate diplomas offered through conventional mode."

### **Profile**

### **Sreenarayanaguru Open University**

Sreenarayanaguru Open University was established by the Govt. of Kerala in September 2020 vide the Government Ordinance No. 45 of 2020. The University is named after Sree Narayana Guru, the great sage, philosopher, poet and social reformer of modern India. Having been established as the 15<sup>th</sup> State University of Kerala, Sreenarayanaguru Open University aims at strengthening the structural dynamics of academic operations for ensuring quality inclusive education for all regardless of age, creed, gender and religion. The University was officially dedicated by Sri. Pinarayi Vijayan, the Hon. Chief Minister of Kerala on 2<sup>nd</sup> of October, 2020.The State Legislature of Kerala unanimously enacted Sreenarayanaguru Open University Act in 2021 January. In pursuance of the legal procedures, Sreenarayanaguru Open University was accorded recognition under the section 2(f) and 22 of the University Grant Commission Act of 1956.

The programme offers 80 hours of instruction and includes additional self-paced practice hours. The delivery will follow a blended mode combining online classes and digital self-learning tools.

**Course Syllabus** 

The Communication Skills and Foundation Course for IELTS and OET has been

meticulously designed to enhance the learner's proficiency in English and prepare them

for international English proficiency tests. The curriculum includes a comprehensive

blend of theoretical knowledge and practical exercises to ensure well-rounded

development in all core language skills: Listening, Speaking, Reading, and Writing

(LSRW). The course modules are carefully curated to reflect real-world communication

needs and scenarios, with each unit focusing on improving specific language

competencies.

**Course Structure** 

The course is divided into several units, each focusing on different aspects of

communication, integrating listening, speaking, reading, and writing activities

alongside grammar and vocabulary development. The following is an outline of the

syllabus content:

**Module 1: Good Memories, Life in the City** 

• Listening: Engaging in conversations about past experiences and urban

lifestyles, understanding descriptions of transport systems.

• Speaking: Introducing oneself, exchanging personal information, reminiscing

about childhood, discussing city infrastructure, and gathering local information.

• Reading and Writing: Writing a paragraph on childhood experiences, creating

an online post on community issues, reading about famous personalities and city

life.

• Grammar Focus: Usage of past tense, habitual actions (used to), expressions of

quantity (countable and uncountable nouns), and forming indirect questions.

Class Time: 8 hours | Self-Paced Practice: 5 hours

Module 2: Making Changes, Have You Ever Tried It?

• Listening: Listening to descriptions of unique accommodations and food

experiences.

• Speaking: Describing features and making comparisons, expressing wishes,

discussing food preferences, and giving instructions.

• Reading and Writing: Writing emails comparing different living spaces,

crafting a recipe, reading stories about lifestyle changes and food history.

• Grammar Focus: Comparatives with adjectives and nouns, expressing wishes,

using past tense and present perfect, and employing sequence adverbs.

Class Time: 8 hours | Self-Paced Practice: 5 hours

Module 3: Hit the Road, Sure! I'll Do It

• **Listening:** Listening to travel advice and survey results on family dynamics.

Speaking: Planning vacations, giving and refusing requests, expressing

apologies and giving excuses.

• Reading and Writing: Writing travel suggestion emails, making polite requests,

and reading about unusual vacations and requests in hotels.

• Grammar Focus: Future tense with be going to and will, necessity and

suggestion using modals, and forming polite requests.

Class Time: 8 hours | Self-Paced Practice: 5 hours

Module 4: What Do You Use This For? Time to Celebrate

• **Listening:** Listening to descriptions of technology and cultural events.

• Speaking: Describing technology, giving instructions, and discussing holidays

and customs.

• Reading and Writing: Writing requests for favors, creating entries on cultural

websites, reading about the sharing economy and global New Year customs.

• Grammar Focus: Usage of gerunds and infinitives, relative clauses of time, and

adverbial clauses using when, after, and before.

Class Time: 8 hours | Self-Paced Practice: 5 hours

**Module 5: Grammar Plus** 

• Additional practice in grammar and writing using downloadable worksheets

covering essential grammar points and advanced writing techniques.

**Class Time:** 8 hours | **Home Practice:** 10 hours

**Module 6: Only Time Will Tell, I Like Working with People** 

• Listening: Listening to discussions about personal changes and job preferences.

**Speaking:** Describing changes over time, discussing skills and job preferences,

and explaining cultural differences.

• Reading and Writing: Writing a paragraph on past, present, and future changes,

composing cover letters, and reading case studies about cultural differences in

workplaces.

• Grammar Focus: Time contrasts, conditional sentences with if clauses, and

forming responses using gerunds.

Class Time: 8 hours | Self-Paced Practice: 5 hours

Module 7: It's Really Worth Seeing, It's a Long Story

Listening: Listening to descriptions of monuments and recounting unexpected

experiences.

• Speaking: Talking about landmarks, sharing experiences, and interpreting

events.

• Reading and Writing: Writing introductory guides for tourists, describing

recent experiences, and reading about global monuments and customs.

Grammar Focus: Passive voice usage, distinguishing past continuous and

simple past, and using present perfect continuous for describing events.

Class Time: 8 hours | Self-Paced Practice: 5 hours

Module 8: That's Entertainment! Now I Get It

• Listening: Understanding opinions, movie reviews, and interpreting signs.

• Speaking: Describing films and books, giving reactions and opinions, and

interpreting gestures and body language.

• Reading and Writing: Writing movie reviews, listing rules for specific

situations, and reading stories about actors and idiomatic expressions.

• Grammar Focus: Participles as adjectives, using relative pronouns, and

expressing possibility and obligation using modals.

Class Time: 8 hours | Self-Paced Practice: 5 hours

Module 9: I Wouldn't Have Done That, Making Excuses

• Listening: Listening to predicaments and radio shows discussing dilemmas.

• Speaking: Giving advice and making polite requests, responding to hypothetical

situations, and offering excuses.

• Reading and Writing: Writing advice-seeking blog posts, reporting survey

responses, and reading online forums about handling conflicts.

• Grammar Focus: Unreal conditional sentences, past modals, and reported

speech for requests and statements.

Class Time: 8 hours | Self-Paced Practice: 5 hours

**Additional Practice and Assessments** 

Self-paced practice: Regular practice sessions using the online workbook,

including grammar and writing exercises.

• **Progress checks:** After every two units, learners will have informal assessments

to track their progress.

• Summative assessments: Final exams include tests on all units covered,

comprising listening, reading comprehension, writing, and speaking tests.
