The conflict arises from the poet's desire to protect her mother while simultaneously accepting the passage of time. On the other hand, in "Aunt Jennifer's Tigers," the internal conflict in Aunt Jennifer's life is revealed through her creation of strong, fearless tigers in her embroidery. The tigers symbolize her longing for freedom and power in contrast to the reality of her oppressed, restricted life. Her internal conflict is shown through her inability to break free from societal norms, despite her creative expression. Both poems beautifully capture the tension between reality and the desire for

something better.

(b) How do the stories "The Last Lesson" by Alphonse Daudet and "Lost Spring" by Anees Jung illustrate the impact of socio-political factors on education? Solution:

In "The Last Lesson" by Alphonse Daudet, the socio-political factor of war directly affects education. When the German forces invade Alsace and Lorraine, they impose the German language on the local population, and the teaching of French is banned. The story highlights how the French language, a symbol of cultural identity, is suppressed due to political conflict. The teacher's last lesson symbolizes the loss of freedom and the impact of war on education. In "Lost Spring" by Anees Jung, the story portrays how socio-economic conditions hinder education for impoverished children. The two boys, Saeeda and the narrator, are forced to work in rag-picking or glass-blowing to survive. The lack of access to proper education reflects the impact of poverty and social neglect. Both stories vividly depict how education is often shaped or limited by larger socio-political factors like war and poverty.

- 13. Answer any one of the following two questions in 120 150 words:
- (a) The author vividly describes the trauma of Zitkala-Sa and Bama in 'Memories of Childhood'. Support with examples from the texts, to illustrate the prejudices that were present in society.

In "Memories of Childhood," both Zitkala-Sa and Bama experience deep trauma due to the societal prejudices they face. Zitkala-Sa, a Native American girl, is forcibly made to cut her long hair and adopt white cultural norms. She experiences alienation and humiliation, symbolized by the cutting of her hair, which represents the loss of her identity. This reflects the prejudice faced by indigenous people as they are coerced to assimilate into mainstream society. Similarly, Bama, in her account from "Memories of Childhood," faces the oppressive caste system. She describes the humiliation she feels when her fellow students look down upon her because of her Dalit background. Both women's experiences highlight how societal norms and prejudices, based on race and caste, impose psychological trauma and restrict their freedom to embrace their true identities.

(b) How did Dr. Sadao plan the American prisoner's escape?

(The Enemy)

Solution:

Dr. Sadao, a Japanese surgeon, faces a moral dilemma when he finds an injured American prisoner on the shore. Despite the political tension of World War II, Dr. Sadao decides to save the prisoner's life. After performing surgery on him, Dr. Sadao plans the prisoner's escape by providing him with the necessary resources. He arranges for a boat to be ready, hiding it at a location that is not easily detectable. Dr. Sadao also gives the prisoner money and clothes to help him escape to a safe location. The escape plan is executed with great caution to avoid detection by the authorities. Dr. Sadao's decision reflects his human compassion and his willingness to defy social and political norms to do what is morally right.

Look for moments when characters act according to their moral beliefs, even when it goes against societal expectations or political pressures. Dr. Sadao's actions in this story highlight this theme.
