### **1.1. THE APPLICATION PROCESS**

Application forms can be accessed **online only** through the Christian Medical College website <http://admissions.cmcvellore.ac.in> from date mentioned on Page 2. The last dates for online application submission with payment of application fee and submission of supporting are given on Page 2. The application fee includes basic administrative fee **plus** registration fee per course applied (or per speciality for courses with different specialities), as given below:

## **GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS**

1. The application form needs to be filled online.
2. Before applying online, ensure that there is **personal active e-mail id** and **current personal mobile number** which will be required for future communication.
3. Candidates must take utmost care in avoiding errors while filling the application form.
4. **The candidate's full name including initials must be as it is in the University/ Board Examination Certificates.**
5. Candidates may apply up to a maximum of two specialities in M.Sc. Nursing & Fellowship in Nursing and three specialities in Post Basic Diploma in Nursing.
6. When applying for more than one speciality, candidates must apply in the **ORDER OF PREFERENCE** for admission into the programmes in the application form.
7. Candidates must scan and keep a soft copy of his / her photograph and signature ready before filling the application form. Specification for photograph: Recent passport size colour photograph (taken after 1<sup>st</sup> January of the application year), light background, JPEG format not exceeding 80 KB (Width – 150 pixels & Height – 150 pixels). Specification for signature: Scanned signature JPEG format not exceeding 50 KB (Width – 150 pixels & Height – 50 pixels).

## **INSTRUCTIONS FOR ONLINE APPLICATION SUBMISSION**

1. Access the CMC admission page at <http://admissions.cmcvellore.ac.in>
2. On clicking the link 'Nursing Postgraduate Courses', the application form page will open.
3. Kindly download and **read the admission bulletin carefully before applying online**
4. Click on the link 'Candidate Registration' and read the instructions carefully.
5. Fill up the Candidate Registration Form with name, gender, **active** personal e-mail id, **current** personal mobile number and date of birth.
6. On submission of the above details, a 'Temporary Login ID' will be generated.. Kindly **copy and save** the 'Temporary Login ID' number, as you will need it to access the application form page again.
7. **For M.Sc. Nursing candidates:** Click on 'speciality preference' and while applying the specialities in the **order of preference**, kindly fill the '**Type of Paper**' you wish to take:
  - i) **Preference of only one speciality:** The candidate can take either the **General paper** **OR** the respective **Speciality paper**.
  - ii) **Preference of two specialities:** The candidate can take either the **General paper** alone for **both** the specialties **OR** **General paper** for one preference and **Speciality paper** for the other preference However, the candidate **cannot take TWO Speciality papers**

8. After submitting the ‘Academic Details and Work Experience’ and ‘Course(s) Applied’, upload photo and signature.
9. PAYMENT can be made by any one of the methods mentioned below:
  - i. Challan payment at no extra cost in any branch of the ICICI Bank of India. While filling payment details in the application form, if ‘ICICI bank challan’ is clicked, a challan will be generated. The challan needs to be printed and signed before it is submitted to the bank. **Once paid, the original challan needs to be sent to the Office of the Registrar, College of Nursing.**
  - ii. Online payment using payment gateway (credit or debit card / net banking).
  - iii. The registration fee for each programme / each speciality has to be paid along with the administrative fee.
  - iv. Any form of fee once paid will **NOT** be refunded under any circumstances.
10. An e-mail and SMS stating ***successful submission of the application*** will be sent to the candidates within a week of final submission
11. After approval of the payment by the Registrar, an **Application number** will be generated. An e-mail stating **‘Approval’ of the application with Application Number** will be sent to the candidate. Please note the application number for future correspondence. If such an email is NOT received, please check with the Office of the Registrar, College of Nursing by e-mail at **registrarcon@cmcvellore.ac.in**
12. Please note that the **entire application form is to be submitted Online**. If it gets interrupted at any stage after submission of the ‘Candidate Registration’ or ‘Personal Details’, one can sign in again into the admission page by **clicking the link ‘Sign in to apply / view’ using the ‘temporary login id’ and ‘date of birth’**. If you forgot to note down the temporary login id or the application number, the process has to begin from the main menu and follow the procedure by clicking ‘Forgot Temporary Login ID / Application Number’

The Hall Ticket will be available at the Christian Medical College website <http://admissions.cmcvellore.ac.in>. One Hall Ticket will be generated per candidate even if the candidate is registered for more than one course. **The Hall Ticket can be downloaded and printed by using application number as ID and date of birth as password.** The Hall Ticket needs to be checked for accuracy of its details. In case of non-availability of the hall ticket one week prior to the date of **Step I** of the selection process, the candidate must contact the Registrar, College of Nursing, by e-mail or telephone. **Kindly mention the application number in all communications.** A duplicate Hall Ticket will be issued or the Hall Ticket number and address of the examination centre will be intimated.

**Note:** If any certificate is in a language other than English, it should be translated to English and attested by a Gazetted officer. **Both the vernacular and attested English versions of the certificate should be sent** to the Registrar’s office. If the subjects learnt are written in code in the mark sheet/ certificate, a copy of the page where the expansion of the code is given has to be sent along with the certificate.

### 1.3 MINORITY NETWORK CATEGORY

The aim of Christian Medical College, Vellore is to train individuals for service in needy areas especially in Christian mission hospitals. Minority Network Category recommendation and certification is a privilege whereby weightage is given to candidates during selection. The certified candidates are expected to understand the spirit of service and compassion for the less fortunate which is integral to CMC. For this purpose, Christian students are encouraged to apply under the Minority Network category.

- Any Minority Network Church / Organization which is a member of “The Christian Medical College Vellore Association or Council” which operates its own medical work, is eligible to recommend and certify candidates for the various educational courses run by CMC, Vellore provided the organization does not run the said course. The list of eligible Minority Network Churches / Organizations is given in **Annexure II**. They certify candidates to various programmes at CMC including nursing with an understanding that the candidates after studies will return to the institution of the Minority Network for Church / Organizations to work in hospitals run by these organizations.
- Candidates are expected to contact these Minority Network for Church / Organizations if they are interested in certification. Minority Network category certification application forms are available with the offices of these organizations and diocese. Minority Network category certification forms are not directly available to the candidate from College of Nursing.
- Candidates who were recommended for any nursing programmes in CMC or another institution by any Minority Network Churches / Organizations must have completed service obligation for the previous study period, if any, **on or before 31<sup>st</sup> August of the admission year**. However, any remaining service period in excess of two years that may have been agreed upon towards recommendation for the undergraduate course may be completed at a later date with the written permission of the Minority Network Church / Organization, provided the candidate is recommended for the PG course by the same Minority Network Church / Organization.

**Candidate must enclose the following documents along with the certification form by the Minority Network for Church / Organization.**

- i. Experience certificate of working for a minimum period of **TWO YEARS** excluding internship, in a mission hospital.
- ii. Service Obligation Completion certificate for the previous programme (if applicable).

## **ELIGIBILITY FOR MINORITY NETWORK CATEGORY CERTIFICATION**

- a. **M.Sc. Nursing:** Candidates should have served a minimum period of two years excluding internship in one or more mission hospitals or community areas of any of the supporting bodies of this institution after completion of B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. (Honors) in Nursing. For those with Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing Degree, the experience in the above mentioned area after the Diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery / alternate course will be considered. These candidates have to enclose the experience certificate from mission hospitals after the Diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery/alternate course along with the application for certification to Minority Network Category.
- b. **Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing:** Candidates should have served a minimum period of two years excluding internship in one or more mission hospitals or community areas of any of the supporting bodies of this institution after completion of Diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery / alternate course.
- c. **Post Basic Diploma in Nursing:** Candidates should have served a minimum period of two years excluding internship in one or more mission hospitals or community areas of any of the supporting bodies of this institution after completion of Diploma in General Nursing and Midwifery / alternate course or B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. (Honors) in Nursing / before or after Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing.
- d. **Fellowship in Nursing:** Candidates should have served a minimum period of two years excluding internship in one or more mission hospitals or community areas of any of the supporting bodies of this institution after completion of B.Sc. Nursing / B.Sc. (Honors) in Nursing /before or after Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing.

**Candidates who do not meet the above criteria will be considered as Open candidates even if they are recommended by a Minority Network Church / Organization.**

- **Office of the Registrar, College of Nursing, WILL NOT CORRESPOND IN THIS REGARD WITH THE CANDIDATE.**

### **SERVICE OBLIGATION:**

1. Minority Network Category candidates are called to serve in the hospitals or outreach medical work of Minority Network for Church / Organization for a specific period of time (not less than two years) as decided by the organizations, immediately after the completion of the programme. The candidate has to sign a service undertaking with the Minority Network for Church / Organization at the time of certification to Minority Network Category. **A copy of this undertaking is to be sent to the College of Nursing along with the certification form by the Minority Network for Church / Organization.**
2. If the service of a certified Minority Network Category candidate cannot be utilized by the Minority Network for Church / Organization, the candidate's name will be circulated for fulfillment of his / her obligation in the hospitals of other Minority Network for Church / Organization of CMC Council. The

Minority Network for Church / Organization which does not utilize the services of its graduate will lose its certification to Minority Network Category privileges for the next academic year.

3. The service obligation should only be in terms of service and not by financial compensation. **Students who do not fulfill their service obligation are not eligible for any higher studies or appointment as staff of Christian Medical College, Vellore. They will not be issued any certificates other than those issued by the University/Board of Nursing Education, NL CMAI SIB and the State Nursing Council.**
4. Transcript and other documents from the College will be released only if the service obligation is fulfilled by service.

## **SECTION 2**

### **2.1 SELECTION PROCESS**

**Selection is based on merit.** Selection process for M.Sc. Nursing, Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing, Post Basic Diploma in Nursing, and Fellowship in Nursing involves Step 1 and Step 2. Step-1- will be an Entrance examination (Computer Based Test). Shortlisted candidates undergo Step 2 of the selection process which involves medical check-up and personal interviews. Candidates applying for the M.Sc. Nursing and Post Basic BSc programmes will also undergo practical tests to assess their knowledge and skills during Step 2. Selection of candidates to any particular programme is based on the performance in the **Step I and Step II** of the selection process. Weightage for selection will be given to candidates if they have served in areas of need, if supported by relevant documents (**Refer Annexure I**)

#### **2.1.1 STEP I- Entrance Examination (Computer Based Test)**

All candidates are required to undertake a Computer Based Test. **The examination will be conducted in the following cities** – BENGALURU, Bhubaneswar, CALICUT, CHENNAI, CHITTOOR (including Thirupathi), COIMBATORE, ERNAKULAM, GUWAHATI, HYDERABAD, JAMSHEDPUR, KOLKATA, KOLLAM, KOTTAYAM, KRISHNAGIRI (including Dharmapuri), LUCKNOW, MADURAI, MEERUT, MUMBAI, PATNA, PUDUCHERRY, SALEM, THIRUSSUR, THIRUVANNAMALAI, THIRUVANANTHAPURAM, TIRUNELVELI, TIRUPATTUR, VELLORE (including Ranipet & Kancheepuram), VIJAYAWADA & VILLUPURAM.

The candidates are expected to report on the stipulated date, time and place mentioned in the hall ticket. No candidate will be permitted to enter the examination hall after 30 minutes of the stipulated examination commencement time. The examination will be conducted in English. More information regarding the entrance test is given in Annexure III titled “Information on Computer Based Tests”.

#### **A) M.Sc. Nursing:**

The selection process starts with **Step I** – Entrance Examination (Computer Based Test). It will be for 1½ hours duration. The first and the second preference examinations will be conducted without any break between the papers. The Step-I process involves taking the **General paper AND /OR Speciality paper**.

- The **General paper** will consist of questions from Medical Surgical, Paediatrics, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Community Health and Psychiatric Nursing
- The **Speciality paper** will consist of questions specific to **each of the above mentioned specialities**.

Refer **Annexure IV** for sample questions. The type of paper available according to the preference/s is explained below:

Only one speciality preference	The candidate can take either the <b>General paper</b> OR the respective <b>Speciality paper</b> .

However, the candidate <b>cannot take TWO Speciality papers</b> .	

## **SUPPLEMENTARY SELECTION (For M.Sc. Nursing only)**

- ❖ A supplementary selection may be conducted for M.Sc. Nursing, if the specified number of seats are not filled in any of the specialities.
- ❖ In such an event, candidates who have cleared **Step-I with General paper** and have not been selected after Step-2 for the preferred specialties will become **eligible for supplementary selection**.
- ❖ Selection of candidates will be based on personal interview and performance in special tests to assess skills.
- ❖ The candidates selected through **Supplementary Selection** will be considered **ONLY under Open category**.
- ❖ The dates for supplementary selection, if conducted, will be displayed in the admission page of the website.

## **B) Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing, Post Basic Diploma in Nursing and Fellowship in Nursing Programmes:**

Computer Based Test for these programmes (General Paper) will be for 1½ hours duration. Questions from Nursing Foundations, Medical – Surgical, Paediatric, Obstetrics and Gynaecology (OBG), Community Health and Psychiatric Nursing will be included. Refer **Annexure IV** for sample questions. Male candidates who have done alternate course in lieu of Midwifery will not be assessed in Obstetrics & Gynaecology Nursing.

### **2.1.2 STEP II - MEDICAL CHECK UP, PERSONAL INTERVIEWS / ASSESSMENT OF KNOWLEDGE & SKILLS**

- The list of candidates short listed for **Step II** of the Selection process (Medical Checkup and Assessment of Knowledge and Skills / Personal Interviews) will be published in the website and also intimated to individuals by e-mail.
- **Step II** of the Selection Process includes medical checkup and personal interviews for M.Sc. Nursing, Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing, Post Basic Diploma in Nursing and Fellowship in Nursing. Candidates will also undergo Special tests to assess knowledge and skills (except for Post Basic Diploma and Fellowship in Nursing programmes).

The registration to **Step II** of the selection process and a medical checkup will be held on the first day and personal interviews with special tests (as applicable) will be conducted on the second and/or third day at College of Nursing, CMC, Vellore (Refer Calendar for Selection 2025-2026). Candidates are expected to report on all days at **7:30 a.m.**

- All candidates called for the **Step II** must bring their chest X-ray taken **within the last 3 months bearing the date and name of the candidate engraved in the film**. Candidates who are currently pregnant or if pregnancy is a possibility are exempted from the chest X-ray.

**All provisionally selected candidates who wish to accept the seat offered must give the acceptance in writing within the date and time stipulated. On failing to do so, the seat will be offered to the next candidate in the waitlist as per the admission policy.**

## 2.3 WAITLIST

The waitlist is drawn based on ranking in the final selection. Waitlists are drawn specifically for each programme. For MSc Nursing program, waitlist is drawn for each speciality. A single waitlist is drawn as per merit, with Minority Network candidates marked with an asterisk. If an Open candidate withdraws from the programme, the vacancy is filled by a Minority Network or Open candidate in the order of merit. If a candidate

from the Minority Network category withdraws, the vacancy is filled by a Minority Network candidate in keeping with the philosophy of the institution.

Waitlisted candidates must keep the Registrar's office updated about their current contact address and telephone numbers. The eligible waitlisted candidate will be sent a provisional offer of admission by e-mail when the vacancy arises. The candidate must provide acceptance in writing or a scanned copy of signed acceptance by e-mail by the date and time stipulated in the offer of provisional admission. As per the selection policy, failure to send an acceptance of the offer within the said date will lead to **automatic forfeiture of the seat** offered and the next eligible candidate in the respective waitlist will be invited to join the course.

## **SECTION 3**

### **3.1 REGISTRATION OF SELECTED CANDIDATES**

All provisionally selected candidates need to be present at the College of Nursing at 8.00 a.m. on the date stipulated for registration to the course. The candidates are expected to produce the documents in **ORIGINAL** at the time of registration. Failure to register and join the course on the stipulated date and time will lead to **automatic forfeiture of the seat** offered and the next eligible candidate in the respective waitlist will be called to join the course as per the selection policy. **Refer Prospectus for more details.**

During registration, Foreign Nationals **MUST** produce the following **additional** documents in **ORIGINAL**:

- a) 'No Objection Certificate' from the Indian Nursing Council
- b) 'No Objection Certificate' duly certified by the concerned embassy of the country of origin
- c) **Course certificate and Registration certificate (RN, RM certificate)** duly certified / sealed by the concerned embassy of the country of origin
- d) Passport first and last page
- e) Copy of student Visa from the Ministry of External Affairs
- f) Residential permit

If a foreign national is selected, the College will take additional steps to validate the genuineness of certificates from the concerned authorities.

### **3.2 WITHDRAWAL**

Candidates who join and withdraw from the course will not be selected for any other course or staff appointment subsequently in this institution. However, if after registration, the student is offered admission in another course within this institution in the same academic year before the last date of registration of the first course, the entire amount paid by the student will be transferred towards the second course. If such movement occurs after the last date of registration of the first course, the tuition fees alone may be transferred, on request.

### **Scholarship**

The College of Nursing Alumni scholarship and the TNAI scholarship are available for all postgraduate students and the Elizabeth Gillespie scholarship is available for Post Basic B.Sc. ### **Accommodation**

### **Library & Advanced Simulation Center for Excellence in Nursing**

Florence Taylor Memorial Library of College of Nursing, spreads over 10,132.06 sq. ft., and is one of the best nursing libraries in India with 11,177 nursing books, 19 e-books, 4,055 bound journals and 1,384 theses. It subscribes 16 International Journals and 22 National Journals. The Library functions from 7:30 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. (Monday-Friday) and 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on Saturdays. It offers vast resources to students for learning. The library can house totally 327 students in its floors at any given time. MyLoft app access is available for faculty and MSc to use Dodd Library resources. It is equipped with Computer Labs and provides Wi-Fi, RFID Kiosk, Scan and Reprographic facility. The library manages its 16,616 resources (books, bound journals and theses) using AutoLib software.

The College of Nursing has a state-of-the-art Simulation Centre that houses high fidelity mannikins that enable student learning in a safe and simulated environment. Student learning is also enhanced through the use of various teaching-learning modalities and audiovisual aids including smartboard.

### **Staff Student Health Services**

### **GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS**

- Each candidate will be assigned a workstation for the Computer Based Test.
- The candidate is required to be present in the test centre as specified in the hall ticket.
- The candidates are not allowed to carry any belongings including mobile phone / cellular phone, pager, palm top, blue tooth device, or any electronic device which has the potential of misuse or unauthorized communication during the examination inside the examination centre.
- The candidate is allowed to carry only pen / pencil inside the test centre.
- The candidate is required to produce the hall ticket at the registration desk without which entry will not be allowed.
- At the registration desk, identity of the candidate is verified, hall ticket scanned, photograph captured, finger print (left thumb impression) taken after which he / she will be assigned to a computer.
- For working purpose one white paper will be provided at the workstation. No additional material will be given for rough work purposes.
- Once seated in the examination hall, the invigilator will take the candidate's signature in a separate attendance sheet and collect the same.

- Any question can be selected directly by clicking on the question number, which will appear at the bottom of the screen. The answered question number will be marked green and the unanswered/ skipped question number will remain in blue.
- In case of doubt in the answer, the question can be marked for review which will be indicated with an arrow mark under the question number. To unmark the question marked for review, get back to the same question and click on the question number.
- If the answer to any question needs to be changed, select the question and change the answer by clicking on the appropriate answer.
- **Each correct answer fetches one mark.**
- **There is no negative marking.**
- The test cannot be submitted until 90 minutes are complete. The “**I have completed the test**” button will appear only on completion of 90 minutes.
- The test closes automatically once the allotted time of 90 minutes is over.
