SECTION A

Reading Skills

1. Read the following passage carefully :

(1) Often, people are getting their news online as the convenience and accessibility of online news is difficult to compete with.

(2) Physical newspapers are typically large, need to be folded and aren't always free, making them an overall hassle. With virtual media outlets being available to nearly everybody at the click of a button, it comes as no surprise that it's grown to be a dominant form of news consumption.

However, it's important for readers to consider exactly what they're consuming when getting their news through an app versus a paper, namely the influence of an algorithm.

(3) A search algorithm is a set of rules made to put forward content the reader is more likely to engage with and filter out what they will ignore. Based on one's viewing history, an app or service determines what kind of content the user enjoys, then recommends similar content from that point onwards. Algorithms give the viewer what they want, that's undeniable, but it's also the problem.

(4) Digital media experts warn readers to be cautious of how an algorithm processes content. These systems show a reader more of what they want, but in the process, they block out any pieces that aren't in sync with their observed beliefs for the sake of customer service. The result is a person who is always given the same type of content, rarely venturing outside of their own viewpoints.

(5) There is, fortunately, a way for readers to still get their news without risking the entrapment of an algorithm: classic print newspapers which are not limited by any ruleset constantly tailoring the words offered to the reader. News in print needs to satisfy every type of reader with only one copy, allowing it to offer a wide scope of topics. Printed news offers its viewership more freedom over what they choose to read.

(6) While an algorithm purposely chooses and narrows potential news, a physical paper's diversity grants its news a more exploratory nature. Taking the time to engage with every part of a physical paper puts a variety of subjects, views and information on display for readers.

(7) It'd be naive to believe that print newspapers are completely free from bias or a certain degree of filtering. Still, a physical newspaper will almost never be as narrow in scope as the suggestions of a digital media outlet will be.

1(vi). State two reasons in support of why a newspaper is a better source of news than online apps.

Solution: First, newspapers provide in-depth coverage of events, ensuring comprehensive and balanced reporting. Second, they are generally more reliable, with content that is fact-checked and edited, whereas online apps may display content that is not verified or could be biased.

This implies that the writer acknowledges that newspapers are not entirely objective or free from external influences. Since the passage does not explicitly mention a single word to complete this sentence, an appropriate inferred answer could be *biased*, *subjective*, or *limited in perception*, similar to online media.

Quick Tip

Correct Answer: (B) discerning.

Solution: The passage discusses how the media, particularly online news, can shape perspectives. It implies that readers should not accept everything at face value but rather engage in critical thinking while consuming news. The term "discerning" refers to the ability to judge well, evaluate sources critically, and recognize potential misinformation. Being merely attentive or focused does not guarantee critical engagement, whereas "indifferent" would suggest a lack of concern. Therefore, the most appropriate answer is **discerning**, as it aligns with the need for analytical thinking when engaging with online news.

Quick Tip

A discerning reader questions sources, cross-checks facts, and remains aware of potential biases in online media.

(2) According to the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC), India aims to skill 400 million people by 2025. Vocational training programmes, such as Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) provide training in fields such as engineering, health care, hospitality, construction and more. According to NSDC estimates, India is expected to witness significant job creation. With the help of this training, opportunities for self-employment have been enhanced. As of July 2021, over 1×5 million candidates have been placed in various jobs after acquiring vocational training.

Now those fellows out there will have the right to say to you, ‘How is it; you pretend to be Frenchmen, and yet you can neither speak nor write your own language ?’ But you are not the worst; poor little Franz. We’ve all a great deal to reproach ourselves with.”

What was the mental state of Franz when his name was called out?

"I like the game," he hums, content to watch it standing behind the fence. "I go inside when no one is around," he admits. "The gatekeeper lets me use the swing."

Saheb too is wearing tennis shoes that look strange over his discoloured shirt and shorts. "Someone gave them to me," he says in the manner of an explanation

What reasons does Saheb give for children like him indulging in scrounging?

His fear was so intense that when a bully threw him into the deep end of the pool, he had to gradually struggle and fight his fear, learning how to overcome it and eventually gain confidence.

oppress her. She lives in constant fear of her husband and is anxious and uncertain about her life. The burdens of her life weigh her down, and she feels trapped by her circumstances, unable to break free.

10(v). Explain the meaning of the word 'Interview' as signified in the lesson.
